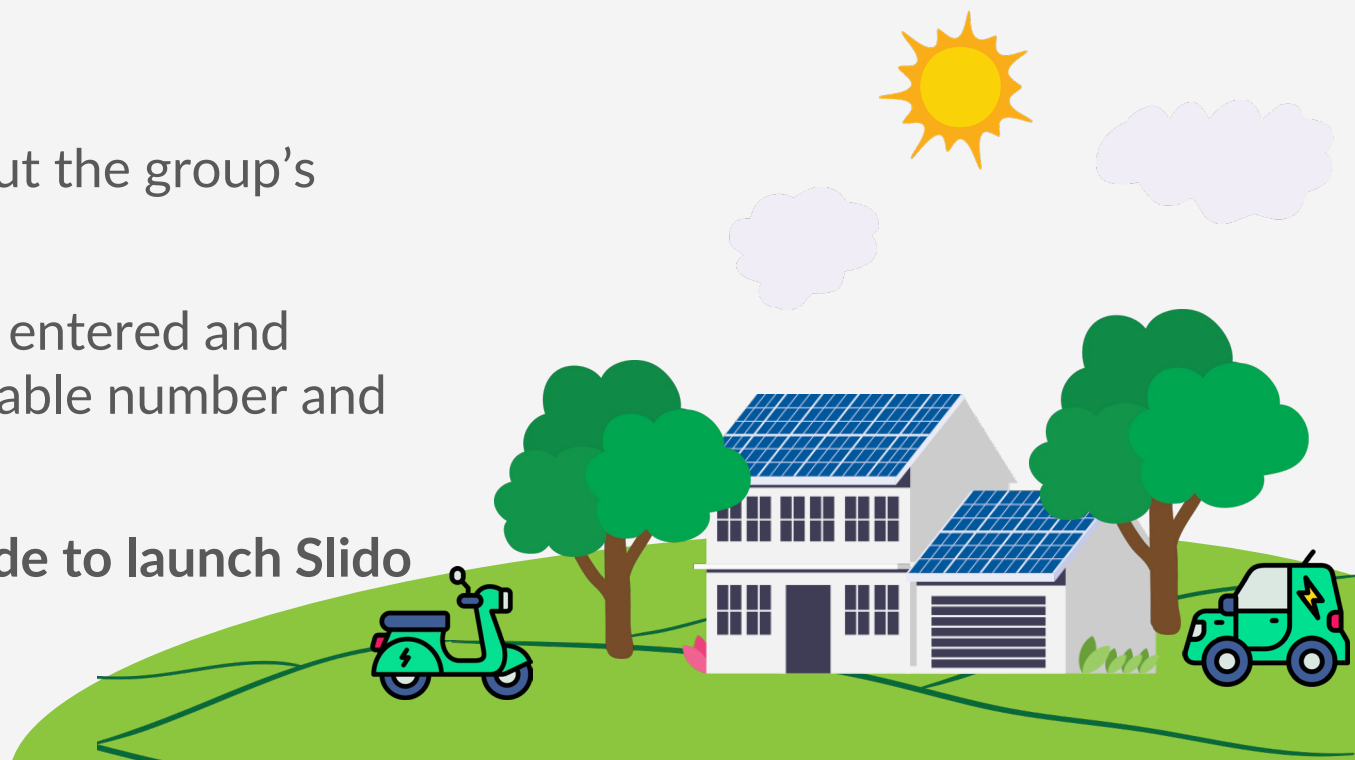
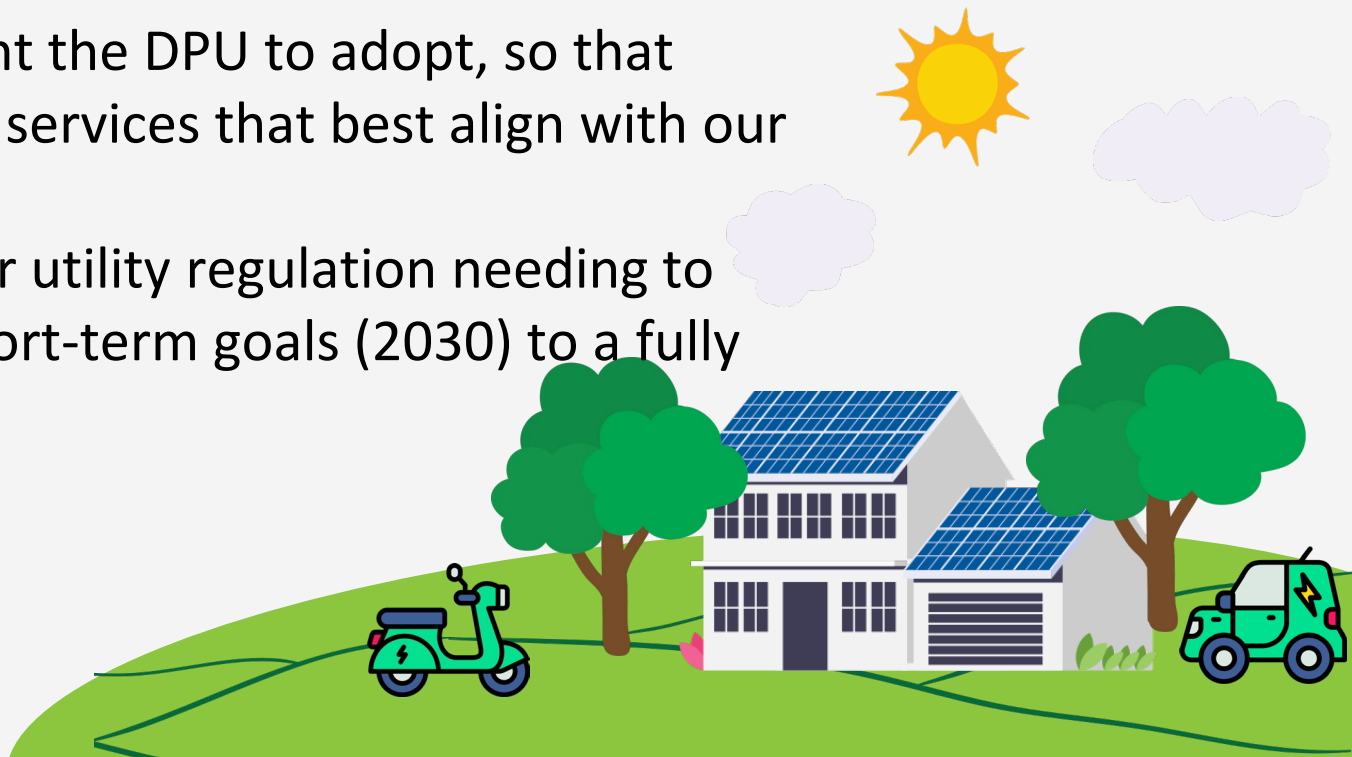


Table Discussion Questions
