Program Background and Goals

Background

- ➤ The Electric Vehicle Coordinating Council (EVICC) awarded MassCEC American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds in early 2024 to advance EV charging infrastructure installation across the Commonwealth
 - Total Program Funding: \$5,430,000

Barriers

- ➤ The program aims to address the barriers to EVSE installment for MHD fleets through the deployment of **Mobile Charging stations**
 - Barriers include: EVSE right sizing, facility upgrade and installation delays, and facility ownership structures.

Program Goals

- Increase access to Mobile Charging and reduce barriers to EV adoption for MHD fleet owners and operators in MA;
- Pilot innovative Mobile Charging stations that can be scaled across the Commonwealth;
- Develop resources for MHD fleet owners and operators in MA to implement Mobile Charging solutions independently; and
- Ensure that small and diverse MA-based businesses are included in the Program and meaningfully compensated to foster MA workforce development.





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Scope of Work

Scope 1: Program Management and Reporting

Scope Summary

 The Technical Consultant will conduct ongoing program management for the Program. Program management and reporting will continue throughout the Program in conjunction with work conducted on all other tasks.

Primary Tasks

- Oversight of the Program and communication between MassCEC, the Technical Consultant Team, and project stakeholders
- Develop a Data Collection for Program metrics
- Provide quarterly reports and monthly updates to MassCEC
- Provide a final report summarizing program benefits, lessons learned, and recommendations for programming at scale

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Scope 2: Implementation

Scope Summary

• The Technical Consultant is responsible for the implementation and technical assistance of Mobile Charging Projects for the selected cohort of fleets. Implementation Projects will fund the procurement and/or installation of Mobile Charging EVSE at selected sites. The Technical Consultant will also support the fleet owners through technical assistance and Project management. Scope 2 will support planning and implementation of charging projects.

Primary Tasks

- Develop a Fleet Selection process with MassCEC
- Conduct a Technology Inventory to identify available Mobile Charging solutions
- Carry out Project Design through Project Agreements, On-Site Assessments & Recommendations, EVSE Procurement,
 Project Implementation, Ongoing Support, and a Maintenance/Operations Plan

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Scope 3: Final Fleet Reports and Public Facing Resources

Scope Summary and Tasks

- The Technical Consultant will provide **Final Commissioning Reports** specific to each fleet.
 - Maintenance and Operations plan (if applicable)
 - Contract transferal of EVSE (if applicable)
 - Recommendations for future charging solutions, procurement and site utility interconnection and incentive guidance
- Develop a Public Facing Resource (i.e. pamphlet, one-pager etc.)
 - The public facing resource will be a tool for future MHD fleet owners and operators to use reference when considering Mobile Charging Solutions

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Application Details

Budget and Eligibility

- ➤ **Total Budget:** \$5,430,000
 - Applicants should propose budgets associated with the 3 Scopes of Work

Justice40 Initiative

- This program is funded by ARPA, as such will follow the Justice40 Initiative
- In accordance with the Justice40 Initiative, applicant teams are strongly encouraged to direct 40% of the overall program benefits to LIDACs
 - See more on the Justice40 Initiative here.

Eligible Applicants

- Applicants are encouraged to form teams comprised of multiple entities
 - Will work together on a proposed project with one entity designated as the Lead Applicant

➤ Supplier Diversity Goals

- Applicant teams are strongly encouraged to include Diverse Suppliers, MA-based vendors, and small businesses.
- MassCEC encourages applicants to aim to allocate 25% of the total funding to Diverse Suppliers.



Are you looking for ONE technical/project manager to develop the program and run it for MassCEC?

• MassCEC encourages Applicants to form a team with sub-vendors, if necessary, to provide all the requisite experience required for the Scope of Work. Proposals must be submitted by a lead Applicant and must clearly identify Applicant Team sub-vendor(s) and their respective roles and experience.

Can I apply if my Applicant Team is not all MA-based?

Yes, but MA-based teams are strongly encouraged.

➤ Can I apply if I do not meet the suggested Supplier Diversity quota?

• While MassCEC encourage applicants to allocate 25% of the funding to diverse suppliers, applicants who make their best efforts are still encouraged to apply.

How is this Program related to the Justice40 Intiative?

 This Program advances President Biden's Justice40 Initiative, which made it a goal that 40% of the overall benefits of certain federal climate, clean energy, affordable and sustainable housing, and other investments flow to disadvantaged communities that are marginalized by underinvestment and overburdened by pollution. Funds awarded through the Program are subject to this requirement.

What is the term length of the program?

- Contracting completed by December 31, 2024
- Work begins January 2025
- All funds must be paid to the Technical Consultant by December 31, 2026
